

Supply List

Forest Landscapes

3-4 Acid free glue sticks for paper (Elmer's glue sticks are great – don't get the kind that are purple and then dry clear).

1 yard Wonder Under

A Pencil to trace branches on the Wonder Under

LARGE rotary cutting mat (beg, borrow or steal one!)

Rotary cutter – make sure it is sharp

A hunk of old batting – doesn't need to be bigger than say 15 x 30 inches
(This is just a pad for gluing our shrubby pieces to the background)

Sharp scissors – smaller ones work best, they should be easy to use when making lots of small cuts. Scissors with serrated edges are great for raw edge applique as they help the edges of your fabric from fraying too badly.

Iron and board – we can share

A good night's sleep – this is an intense class!

***Sewing machine set up for free motion quilting

***Monofilament thread for the top, fine strong light colored thread for the bobbin

If you are like me, you'll be wiping sticky gluey fingers on the butt of your jeans... wear old ones.

***Most of my students do not get to the sewing stage. (In fact I've only had 2 students get to this stage in the 4 years I've been teaching this class!) If you are VERY fast and have had experience messy cutting, arranging and painting then bring your machine. (Don't bother setting up your machine when you first come to class, we will be designing and cutting out fabrics and you'll need the room).

We will be working with permanent paints. Please please don't wear any clothes you care a lot about! ☺
